

South Cumberland Business Association Scholarship - Fort Hill

The recipient must be a **student from Fort Hill high school** with a high school grade point average of 2.5 or above. Preference will be given to freshmen. Applicants must be U.S. citizens and full-time or part-time students. Award based on financial need.

Dr. and Mrs. Somashekhar V. Bellary Scholarship

Applicants must be enrolled full-time at FSU. The award will be given to an incoming freshman from an Allegany County school who is interested in mathematics. The Department of Mathematics' Scholarship Committee may require additional information, essay, recommendations, interview, etc.

Jenny Apsey Stegmaier Memorial Scholarship

The recipient must be a transfer student from Allegany College or a **freshman** who graduated from a high school in Allegany County, MD; be accepted for admission or be enrolled at FSU; have a declared intent to be an art major and graduate with a Bachelor of Fine Arts (B.F.A.) in art and design or its successors. Recipients must have demonstrated ability in visual arts and may be required to provide a portfolio of materials for review by the Awards Committee of the Visual Arts Department.

Tam Science Achievement Award

The recipient must be an **entering freshman** with demonstrated ability in science and the intention to major in physics or engineering. A preference will be given to applicants having achieved a top three ranking in Physics, Engineering, Earth and Space Science, or top three overall ranking at the Western Maryland Regional Science Expo of Allegany and Garrett counties.

Cumberland Lions Club Scholarship

The recipient must be a resident of Cumberland, MD and be an **incoming freshman** who graduated from an Allegany County high school or a veteran. Documented financial need and a 3.0 or higher high school grade point average is required of incoming freshmen. Veterans must have a 3.25 or higher grade point average. To retain the scholarship for a second semester, the student must maintain at least a 2.75 FSU grade point average.

Wensel-Faherty Allegany County Scholarship

The recipient must be enrolled as a full-time **freshman**. A minimum of two annual awards will be given. One or more awards will be given to graduates from a high school in each of Allegany and Garrett Counties. Recipients must have demonstrated academic ability with an overall grade point average of at least 3.5. Preference will be given to equally qualified applicants based on demonstrated participation in extra-curricular activities (may include community, social, or athletic activities) and demonstrated financial need.

Allegany County Association for Family and Community Education Scholarship

The recipient must be a graduate of a high school in Allegany County, Maryland, with a minimum grade point average of 3.0. Preference will be given to 4-H Club members and members or direct descendants of members of the Allegany County Association for Family and Community Education (formerly the Homemakers Club). Applicants, including transfer students, will be eligible upon completing 59 or more hours of college level credit (junior class standing) and being enrolled or accepted at FSU with an overall FSU grade point average of 3.0 or better.

Paul E. and Betty J. Barry Scholarship

The recipient must be enrolled full-time at FSU with an overall grade point average of 3.0 or better. Preference will be given first to renewal applicants - award may be received for three consecutive years if overall grade point average of 3.0 or greater is maintained. Second preference given to Frostburg residents who have graduated from a high school in Allegany County, MD, with demonstrated participation in extra-curricular activities, volunteer service to the community, and clubs and organizations.

Fort Cumberland Lodge #211 and Ohr Lodge #131 Scholarship

Applicants must be residents of Allegany County (MD) and attended Allegany College with an overall grade point average of 3.0 or higher. The recipient will have attained or completed sophomore class status and be declared as a full-time student at FSU. Preference will be given to undergraduate renewal applicants maintaining a minimum FSU grade point average of 3.0. The award may be received for two consecutive years.

Jeanette and C. William Gilchrist Scholarship

The recipient must be a graduate of Allegany College of Maryland, entering FSU with junior or senior class status. Allegany College grade point average must be at least 3.0. Need may be a determining factor. The scholarship may be renewed if a 3.0 FSU grade point average is maintained.

Jane H. Grindel Scholarship

The recipient must be a resident of Allegany County (MD) with demonstrated academic ability and be accepted or enrolled as a full-time student at FSU with a grade point average of 3.0 or better. Documented financial need may be a determining factor. The scholarship may be renewed.

Hooley Plunge Special Education Presidential Merit Scholarship

The recipient will be a resident of Allegany County (MD) enrolled full-time as a graduate or undergraduate (junior or senior) student with an outlined course of study leading to a career field related to special education and/or working with the developmentally disabled (i.e. education, social work, et. al.). The recipient will have an overall grade point average of at least 3.5. Transfer student applicants must have a cumulative grade point average of at least 3.5. Preference will be given to students who demonstrate past/present experience related to working with individuals with developmental disabilities (i.e. volunteer, relevant employment, personal experience, etc.).

Allegany County Teachers Association Scholarship

The recipient must be a graduate of an Allegany County high school in Maryland, a declared education major and a full-time student. The recipient may be a junior or senior. An overall FSU grade point average of 3.0 or above is required, as is an essay on "Why Education is My Career Choice."

Allegany County Teachers Federal Credit Union Scholarship

The recipient must be a junior or senior full-time education major and a graduate of an Allegany County (MD) high school with a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.0.

Jack and Lois Elliott Scholarship

Applicants must be enrolled full-time in the Department of Education Professions at FSU majoring in Elementary Education. The recipient(s) must have an overall grade point average of at least 3.0. and legal residence in any of the following counties: Allegany, Garrett (Maryland), Mineral, Hampshire (West Virginia), and Bedford, Somerset (Pennsylvania). Preference will be given to applicants having demonstrated financial need.

G. Wesley and Margaret M. Forrester Education Scholarship

Applicants must be enrolled full-time in the Department of Educational Professions and have demonstrated financial need. The recipient(s) must have an overall grade point average of at least 3.0 and be a resident of any one of the following counties in Maryland: Frederick, Washington, Allegany, and Garrett.

Amy and Martha Meek Scholarship

The recipient must be a junior education major and a graduate of an Allegany County, MD, high school, with a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.0. Applicants should show participation in extra-curricular activities and community service. Preference will be given to females, renewal applicants, and graduates of Mountain Ridge High School. The scholarship may be renewed.

Roscoe G. Bartlett Scientific Scholarship

The recipient must be a full-time student with a declared major in math/biology/chemistry/physics or engineering and a resident of the Sixth Congressional District (Allegany, Carroll, Frederick, Garrett, Howard or Washington

counties of Maryland). The applicant must have an overall GPA of 3.0 or above and a 3.5 GPA in the major. A preference is given to renewal applicants. Demonstrated need may be a determining factor.

Reverend George M. and Mrs. Phyllis C. Harpold Presidential Merit Scholarship in Biology

Applicants must be enrolled full-time with a major in the Department of Biology. The recipient will be a resident of Allegany or Garrett County (Maryland) with an overall grade point average of at least 3.5. Incoming freshman applicants must demonstrate strong academic achievement in high school as evidenced by class rank and SAT scores in the upper quartile. Transfer students must have a cumulative GPA of at least 3.5. Preference will be given to applicants in the following order of importance (1) academic ability and (2) demonstrated financial need. Need is determined by applicants' completion of a current FAFSA form which must be submitted by published financial aid deadlines. Applicant should include a statement that answers the following question: 'How are you going to use your education to learn to think for yourself?'

Walter and Annette Brock Environmental Studies Scholarship

Applicants must be enrolled (full-time or part-time) in FSU's Department of Geography majoring in Environmental Analysis and Planning or appropriate related programs developed in the future. The recipient(s) must have an overall grade point average of at least 3.0. Preference will be given in the following order: 1) renewal applicants, 2) students with legal residence in Allegany, Garrett counties in Maryland; Mineral, Hampshire counties in West Virginia; and Bedford, Somerset counties in Pennsylvania, and 3) academic ability.
